If someone you know is missing:

CALL 911 or your local law enforcement agency.

OBTAIN photographs and descriptions of the missing person.

VERIFY where the person was last seen.

involved criminal background checks, and driving records checks. Members are required to successfully complete the National Association of Search and Rescue's Fundamental of Search and Rescue course. Certifications in first aid and CPR also are required. Once you become a member, you are required to participate in team and individual training for yourself, and if you're a dog handler or horse rider, for vour animal. We train like we search so we are always prepared.

How to apply

If you still think you have what it takes to be a member of Brunswick Search and Rescue, vou'll need to start the application process. What to expect

Dog handlers and other members of the team usually train weekly, often concentrating on one aspect of search. Training is usually held outside and in all types of weather, hot or cold, rain or shine. Occasionally we train on our boat so we'll be ready if we are called to assist in locating a drowning victim in in a lake, stream or river. While training is rigorous, applicants also should consider the physical and emotional demands of actual searches, which can be under extreme conditions and sometimes involve unpleasant circumstances. Still think you have what it takes? Apply.
